Hey folks,

Today has been very slow for any intel updates. We know a registered student organization hosted events last Thursday and Friday to make signs for events this week. Several groups have continued to argue about an approach to protests next week, with more apparent support being for not occupying any space in violation of the law. There are still community groups preparing (collecting tents, sleeping bags, etc) and encouraging students to engage in an encampment style event. This week's events continue to be advertised as a week of protests from May 1-7 and there have been no changes to the event for tomorrow, which is still beginning at 9am. We are actively monitoring multiple areas of campus for any increased activities tonight and into the early morning hours.

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We do not have a HISSN room established for this event but could if things escalate. No EOC has been activated however emergency management is aware, monitoring, and assisting with planning.

Please do not disseminate the attached document any further.

A protest group of about 300 met this morning on Library Mall. They listened to speeches and then produced tents in wagons. Officers and dean of students protest support team attempted contact with those starting to put up tents and were denied access by protestors locking arms. The group is currently at about 150, with a dozen or so tents set up. They have produced multiple variations of "demands" and have assigned a team to communicate with UW officials. A meeting is currently going on with UW staff and the protestors.

UW's Protest Decision Team has been activated an engaged.

There has been anti-law enforcement sentiment and threats to use force if law enforcement attempts to intercede. Law enforcement is still in the area of the event monitoring the event for safety.

There are counter-protestors on scene sporadically and we have set up a location for counter-protests should groups return.

Multiple media groups are present.

We have a Web EOC up and operating for this incident, being monitored by emergency management as well as a Teams channel. DOA and all of State Patrol has been added for access. If you need to be added to one of these groups, please reach out to Deputy Director of Emergency Management, Tim Slater, tim.slater@wisc.edu.

Command post is operational at UWPD and we are operating on an encrypted UWPD channel.

MPD, DCSO, Capitol PD, and WSP are aware of this incident. WSP Capt. Zeeh is in the command post and we are making contingency plans with them now.

Subject: Intel Update

Hey folks,

Today has been very slow for any intel updates. We know a registered student organization hosted events last Thursday and Friday to make signs for events this week. Several groups have continued to argue about an approach to protests next week, with more apparent support being for not occupying any space in violation of the law. There are still community groups preparing (collecting tents, sleeping bags, etc) and encouraging students to engage in an encampment style event. This week's events continue to be advertised as a week of protests from May 1-7 and there have been no changes to the event for tomorrow, which is still beginning at 9am. We are actively monitoring multiple areas of campus for any increased activities tonight and into the early morning hours.

We have heard some concerns from a few UW affiliated persons that they believe students have been quiet as they plan for a larger event and are not sharing the info widely. We have nothing to support this at this time, however it's possible they are not using open-source networks like social media platforms and have moved to smaller, more direct communications. Intel analysts from WSIC are observing the same.

Weather conditions will improve greatly starting tomorrow through Friday with stable conditions, warm with highs in the lower 70's, lows in the 50's, with rain chances Monday, then sunny through Friday. Weather conditions will be favorable to protest activity.

I've attached an intel update from yesterday morning with no update as there have been no changes to what we're seeing now.

The UW leaders have contingency meetings set up for tomorrow morning at 7am and 10am. Should something break overnight it will be possible for us to pull in others as needed. If an event begins on campus, a command post will be established at UWPD, 1429 Monroe Street, Madison. We will operate on UW Special Event 5 radio channel unless there is a need to bring in outside agencies that do not have our channels, or our channels are compromised. In those instances, we'd likely utilize a statewide interoperability channel or request the use of an encrypted MPD channel via the Dane County Communications Center. Should a CAPMAR (Capitol Area Police Mutual Aid Response) request be made for emergency assistance, our staging area will be on Lake Street and Lake Mendota Court. UWPD will assign a staging manager on site. UWPD will provide a staging location if a non-emergency response is requested and there is additional time to plan and approach considerations can be made in a more methodical manner.

We do not have a HISSN room established for this event but could if things escalate. No EOC has been activated however emergency management is aware, monitoring, and assisting with planning.

Protesters have been told they can remain on campus and continue to engage their first amendment rights. The only thing that could not stay were the tents. This was a decision made by the University.

UWPD requested mutual aid from State Patrol, Dane County Sheriff's Office and the Madison Police Department. We were the last agency to enter campus. Members of our Special Events Team, which has additional training in crowd control, were utilized. These are the same officers who worked Mifflin, when we saw a crowd of thousands of people just this past Saturday.

UWPD would have information on the arrests.

Officers immediately left the area after tents were removed.

It is important to stress they were wearing protective gear, not riot gear.

We are hearing word that students plan to bring more tents to campus later this morning. UWPD is obviously monitoring this and will request our assistance if needed.

Dear Campus Community,

As you may be aware, this morning around 7 a.m., the University of Wisconsin Police Department (UWPD), in concert with partner law enforcement agencies and with my authorization, cleared the unlawful tent encampment on Library Mall. Over the last few days, we have repeatedly asked the protesters to bring their demonstration into conformity with the law that prohibits camping on UW grounds. They declined to do so.

This morning, those present at the encampment were given several warnings during which time they were offered the opportunity to peacefully leave the encampment with their belongings and avoid being either cited or arrested. These warnings [followed prior communications](#), including two messages from campus leaders, that clearly delineated the expectation of consequences if the encampment was not removed.

We appreciate that many protesters chose the option of avoiding legal consequences in exchange for removing tents and other camping supplies from campus grounds. A set of individuals, including some faculty and staff, obstructed law enforcement efforts to remove the tents and were cited.

To repeat: Every individual was given the opportunity to move away from the tent area and continue peaceful protest without further police engagement. While many chose to do so, approximately 30 protesters were cited and several others resisted police action to remove tents or otherwise interfered with the operation and were arrested. There is a good deal of conversation on social media about this operation, some of it inaccurate. [Here is the UWPD overview of the operation.](#) UWPD will continue to monitor for illegal activity.

I cannot emphasize strongly enough our support for free expression and peaceful protest.

I also recognize that it is deeply felt pain and horror about the tragic and devastating loss of life and scale of destruction in Gaza that has fueled some of our community members' desire to protest in ways that go beyond what is legal and permissible. UW–Madison has a long and proud history of fighting for deeply felt causes and exercising our right to free expression. Civil disobedience has been a time-honored tradition in our nation, including here. Yet it is a long-standing element of the civil disobedience tradition to respect the laws we share and to accept that there are consequences for violating them. It is this that distinguishes civil disobedience from mere lawlessness.

Further, I take very seriously the trust that is placed in me to help protect the safety of our campus community. While the gathering on Library Mall this week had been largely peaceful, we have witnessed disturbing accounts of people not affiliated with the campus coming into the area, attracted by the encampment, and engaging in confrontational and other inciteful behaviors. Such an increased risk to the safety of our community, which would be expected to grow over time, was a significant contributing factor to today's action to address the illegal encampment. A small number of blatantly antisemitic actions on the grounds of the encampment have been credibly reported, but we have no evidence that any members of our UW–Madison community engaged in this odious activity.

We have received and are investigating bias reports involving individuals from outside of our campus community. The presence of non-community members, including, reportedly, several highly aggressive individuals, is one of the predictable harms of an encampment like the one illegally staged on our campus and is one of the reasons we chose to act today. Let me state clearly that true threats and harassment based on one's identity, religion or national origin will not be tolerated on our campus. Anyone experiencing this is urged to file a bias report. And let me repeat loudly and unequivocally that we must all roundly condemn both Islamophobia and antisemitism.

Like many other college campuses across the country and the world, we expect to continue to face protest activity, and we recognize and respect that protest is part of our community's precious right to free speech and expression. But such rights are not unlimited: The boundaries that our laws and code of conduct place on speech are meant to ensure that all have access to our common spaces and that dialogue takes place without intimidation or exclusion.

Now that the tents have been removed, and as long as protest abides by campus and state rules and policies, members of my leadership team stand ready to continue to listen to the concerns of the members of our community involved in this week's protest. This was a brenda.gonzalez@wisc.edu ~~generation~~ we communicated to protesters repeatedly.

In addition, we have held a valuable set of engagements around issues of concern with members of Muslim, Palestinian and Jewish communities over the course of this academic year and we invite continued dialogue. I recognize that many in the Muslim and Palestinian communities on our campus continue to feel unheard and hope we can create further opportunities for engagement and understanding.

I also understand that many of our Jewish community members have experienced fear and anxiety during this year as well as during this week's protest. I am grateful to campus partners and others who provided care for them over the past several challenging days during which they sought to celebrate the conclusion of Passover.

The role of campus leadership is not to take sides in national and international debates, or to make special allowances for particular points of view, but to ensure that all participants in campus life have access to university resources for learning and growth. We recognize that the campus debates of the last few months take place in the shadow of international violence that has touched a great many students, faculty and staff, either directly or indirectly. This violence has created strong emotions of fear and anger among many segments of our community.

We express our profound empathy for those who have had to navigate this academic year amid ongoing grief and heartbreak due to the devastating destruction, injustice, and loss of life in Israel and Gaza. And as we collectively reflect on the activities and lessons of the past week, let us, even in the midst of great challenge, do all we can to recognize and respect each other's humanity and seek to understand those with viewpoints different from our own.

Let me state clearly that true threats and harassment based on one's identity, religion or national origin will not be tolerated on our campus. Anyone experiencing this is urged to file a bias report. And let me repeat loudly and unequivocally that we must all roundly condemn both Islamophobia and antisemitism.

Like many other college campuses across the country and the world, we expect to continue to face protest activity, and we recognize and respect that protest is part of our community's precious right to free speech and expression. But such rights are not unlimited: The boundaries that our laws and code of conduct place on speech are meant to ensure that all have access to our common spaces and that dialogue takes place without intimidation or exclusion.

Now that the tents have been removed, and as long as protest abides by campus and state rules and policies, members of my leadership team stand ready to continue to listen to the concerns of the members of our community involved in this week's protest. This was a condition we communicated to protesters repeatedly.

In addition, we have held a valuable set of engagements around issues of concern with members of Muslim, Palestinian and Jewish communities over the course of this academic year and we invite continued dialogue. I recognize that many in the Muslim and Palestinian communities on our campus continue to feel unheard and hope we can create further

opportunities for engagement and understanding.

I also understand that many of our Jewish community members have experienced fear and anxiety during this year as well as during this week's protest. I am grateful to campus partners and others who provided care for them over the past several challenging days during which they sought to celebrate the conclusion of Passover.

The role of campus leadership is not to take sides in national and international debates, or to make special allowances for particular points of view, but to ensure that all participants in campus life have access to university resources for learning and growth. We recognize that the campus debates of the last few months take place in the shadow of international violence that has touched a great many students, faculty and staff, either directly or indirectly. This violence has created strong emotions of fear and anger among many segments of our community.

We express our profound empathy for those who have had to navigate this academic year amid ongoing grief and heartbreak due to the devastating destruction, injustice, and loss of life in Israel and Gaza. As we move into the waning days of this academic year, I look forward to a commencement celebration with the very special class of 2024 who largely missed out on their high school graduation festivities because of the pandemic. I thank our faculty and staff for providing a rich and impactful educational experience to our students over the past year. And as we collectively reflect on the activities and lessons of the past week, let us, even in the midst of great challenge, do all we can to recognize and respect each other's humanity and seek to understand those with viewpoints different from our own.

Chancellor Mnookin's Faculty Senate remarks on Library Mall encampment
May 6, 2024

Today, Chancellor Jennifer L. Mnookin presented before a meeting of the Faculty Senate, where media and protestors were also present. Her remarks are below.

Good afternoon, and welcome to the final Faculty Senate meeting of the academic year.

I understand there may be people in this room who are here in protest. I want to reiterate your right to be here.

We find ourselves at an incredibly difficult moment as citizens of a global community, as a nation, and as a campus. As of today, we're aware that nearly 35,000 people have been killed in Gaza since Hamas attacked Israel on Oct. 7, killing 1,200 people and taking 250 hostages. These events have caused tremendous pain, fear, and hurt, and have fueled protest and civil disobedience on campuses across the country, including our own.

A week ago today, protestors established an illegal tent encampment on Library Mall. I want to take my time today to talk about what this has meant for our campus and also what lies before us while the encampment continues.

First, I want to acknowledge how painful it has been for so many of us, including me, to have had the kinds of interactions with our students

and some of our faculty this past week that none of us would ever choose.

I also want to acknowledge that what we are discussing today, here on our campus, is substantively complex and, importantly, a currently unresolved situation. We are in active discussions with protest organizers to attempt to find a resolution. Given this reality, and that it is unresolved, I will not take questions today but commit to you that I would be glad to do so at a future date.

I also think it is important that I use our time together to listen to your concerns. Therefore, at the conclusion of my remarks and those of our University Committee Chair, we will welcome faculty to voice their views.

First, I want to speak about the safety concerns tied to the encampment.

I understand that it very likely is not at all the intent of our student protestors to create a community safety risk, but I do believe this has been a clear outcome of their actions.

We are increasingly concerned about reports of incendiary rhetoric, antisemitic comments, Islamophobia, the potential for violent conflict with outside groups, and the risk of seeing this situation spiral out of control. This is an inherent risk in an open encampment on our campus in the middle of our city.

And we have seen these situations occurring elsewhere, including, most dramatically, my former campus at UCLA and of course Columbia, and desperately want to avoid a similar situation happening here.

This weekend, we also received reports that a coalition of outside groups created pro-terror group and antisemitic chalkings downtown during the Dane County Farmers Market. This was connected to an event that involved two of our own registered student organizations. We have moved to [suspend these two groups](#) (pending an investigation.)

I met today with a group of Jewish student leaders, faculty, religious leaders, and community partners and heard them describe their experience on our campus — including this week on Library Mall when at or near the encampment — including examples of where they have

been targeted, surveilled and even threatened. I recognize that our Muslim, Arab and Palestinian students have also had such experiences.

In fact, just this afternoon, we're hearing about [Islamophobic messages](#) that were reported near the encampment that have also been reported to Madison Police.

To be clear, the threat is not simply about friction and potential flashpoints within our community. An illegal encampment creates still more significant external risks. What happened at UCLA, an institution of which I was part for 17 years, shows us that in very clear terms and makes clear this risk is neither fanciful nor hypothetical.

That is precisely part of why encampments are not a permitted form of protest here at UW–Madison.

I believe you all already recognize that encampments are prohibited on campus lands under state law, UW Board of Regents Administrative Code Ch. 18.

Many schools do not have nearly our degree of clarity on this point. In addition, many schools, especially private institutions, can close off critical central parts of their outdoor campus to non-affiliates. That is not so here.

Chapter 18's restrictions on encampments were communicated to our community multiple times. I want to note that Chapter 18 does make reference to the possibility of exception, and a number of people have asked why I can't just allow the encampment to stand.

This is really important for everyone here to understand: I cannot authorize a singular exception under Chapter 18 for one organization to protest in this manner unless I am prepared to make the same decision for all other groups who might want something similar.

The reason is straightforward: We are a public institution, which means that we must — according to the First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution — remain content neutral when it comes to making decisions about what is allowed to take place on our campus.

If I grant an exception to permit this encampment, I would need to grant an exception for any group that wished to set up such an encampment, regardless of the cause.

How would we respond if a neo-Nazi group — such as the one we had

here in Madison in November – made similar use of campus lands? This need not be entirely hypothetical. Let me share with you a voicemail we received last week.

Those of you who think that I should simply let this encampment stay, I ask you: Imagine that the protesters were there for a cause you did not share, or one to which you were deeply and profoundly opposed? Would you think and want the same? If not, you are proposing that we violate the First Amendment.

This collection of risks is why, last Wednesday, in consultation with my leadership team, Faculty Senate leadership, and UWPD, I authorized law enforcement to take down any tents that protestors would not voluntarily remove on their own.

Organizers were asked multiple times to remove the tents voluntarily in the days and minutes leading up to the decision. UWPD issued multiple reminders that protestors would not face penalty if they peacefully left the encampment with their belongings.

Many protestors chose to leave voluntarily. However, a set of individuals, including some faculty and staff, obstructed law enforcement efforts to remove the tents.

And since that time, even more tents have gone up. We have not attempted to immediately clear them again due to the significant safety risks to all involved in doing so. We came to a decision that we wanted to begin discussion to attempt, if possible, to resolve this situation as quickly as possible, and that, as I have stated, has been underway.

Law enforcement action against members of our own community, even when the law is clearly being broken, is the last thing a chancellor or president of a university ever wants to do. And I know from direct communication with interim Chief Plisch that these are not the interactions UWPD would wish to have with our students or employees.

I realize that many of you wish I had not made that decision and I respect that there can be reasonable disagreement on that score. Some people think that there are no safety risks created by the encampment; in my view there very much are. And some people think that the rules don't matter or shouldn't apply, and I cannot agree with

that either.

Organizers of the encampment have provided us with a list of demands they want to see met before they will dismantle their tents. These demands are centered primarily on divesting and cutting academic ties with Israel.

Putting aside the substantive merits of divestment, the simple reality is that we do not control how the great bulk of our endowment is managed and invested. These decisions are quite literally not at all under my control.

WFAA, for instance, manages a significant part of our portfolio. They are a separate, independent 501c3 non-profit organization, which means we do not and cannot govern their investment decisions. This separation is required by Regent policy.

Acceding to boycotts against Israel—such as ending the George L. Mosse Graduate Exchange Fellows, named for the revered founder of modern Jewish Studies – would both be a violation of state law and run counter to our deeply held respect for academic freedom and the free exchange of ideas.

I, and I know many of you, believe that it's dangerous to limit our academic engagements based on viewpoints. This is, truly, the basis for the notion of Sifting and Winnowing that is honored on the plaque attached to this very building — a principle that has been held dearly by this group on many occasions in the past.

All of this said, there may be ways that we can encourage further conversations about these deeply felt issues as PART of sifting and winnowing. We have been working to understand if there might be ways that we can help the protesting students have further opportunities to share their views with those who do have more direct authority than I.

In closing:

I in no way want to shut down the opportunity for meaningful protest, nor have I done so. Nor do I want to shut down the opportunity for imagining better worlds or creating stronger communities. At the same time, time, place and manner restrictions do not violate the First Amendment. Rather, they are needed to ensure its proper functioning and access to our whole campus for all.

I know many of you who have come to join this meeting today disagree with some of the choices that I have made. I respect that. And I also know that ALL of us care about our students and our community.

Even during this difficult time, there have been beautiful moments of connection. Some of those I have seen directly, and others I have heard about. I have heard directly about the powerful experience of community from some participants in the encampment, who have also shared that they are finding deep meaning in this form of protest. And I have also heard about the powerful creation of community in this moment from some of those who feel most threatened by it.

There is no doubt that global events are heartbreaking right now. Notwithstanding that, how can we work jointly to create a world and a community where our students — with all of their diverging and cacophonous and strongly held perspectives, with their passion and intelligence and commitments — can work to learn from each other, even as they disagree? How can we work together to build a world in which they could ALL feel that UW–Madison belongs to them?

We have work to do, but I hope that is a question and a challenge we can take up together.

Dear Mayor Rhodes-Conway,

I hope this email finds you well.

I wanted to ensure you received this message from UW Madison that I sent to the Common Council today. Please see the email below and attached copy for your convenience.

As Common Council members consider the Substitute Resolution for Legistar Item 83214 (Supporting Student Organizers & Reaffirming Commitment to Peaceful Resolution) the university wants to address several issues that are referenced in the Resolution.

It's important to make clear that the university fully supports students and others in the exercise of their First Amendment rights, and many protests have occurred on campus without incident historically and just this academic year. The campus regularly communicates with students, faculty and staff that we respect the lawful exercise of those rights, and in no way seeks to interfere with them. In the situation that is the subject of this Resolution, our goal was not to stop lawful protest but rather to enforce the state law that prohibits camping on university property. Organizers were asked multiple times to remove the illegal encampment in the days leading up to the law enforcement action to remove the tents on May 1, and UWPD issued multiple reminders that protestors would not face penalty if they peacefully left the encampment with their belongings on that morning.

This is, unfortunately, not what happened. While many protestors chose to leave voluntarily, a set of individuals, including some students, faculty, staff, and others not affiliated with the university obstructed law enforcement efforts to remove the tents and used force against officers who tried to carry out this duty, prompting reaction.

However, implications or allegations that law enforcement personnel used unnecessary force during the events of May 1 are inaccurate. Law enforcement was sent in to clear the illegal encampment – not to stop the protest - and only responded to the use of force by protestors intent on stopping them from doing so. Law enforcement responded proportionally to the resistance they faced and

immediately ceased the response once compliance was obtained, although we recognize the unintended impact that often occurs with interactions between underrepresented individuals and law enforcement.

Further, the university recognizes that the student protestors do not intend to create a community safety risk, yet this has been an outcome of the illegal encampment. There have been reports of incendiary rhetoric and antisemitic comments against those walking nearby, reports of Islamophobia, the potential for violent conflict with outside groups, and the risk of seeing this situation spiral out of control. We have seen this occur at universities elsewhere around the country and want to avoid a similar situation happening on our campus and in our community.

Since May 1 the university has in good faith been engaging in ongoing discussions with protest organizers in the hopes of finding a mutually acceptable resolution. We have committed to not asking law enforcement to take further action against the encampment while productive conversations are proceeding (barring an emergency), and hope that we will be able to find a resolution soon.

Agreement reached to resolve Library Mall tent encampment

On Friday, May 10, campus leaders and student representatives from Students for Justice in Palestine (SJP) reached a resolution to end the encampment on Library Mall.

With the agreement, SJP will clear the encampment today and has committed that it will not disrupt this weekend's graduation ceremonies or other campus functions, nor reestablish an encampment on our campus. In addition, SJP has committed to following UW–Madison rules in its future activities. We appreciate reaching resolution with SJP and acknowledge the support they received from their faculty liaisons.

This has been a difficult period for our campus, our nation and the world. We want to be clear that UW–Madison supports peaceful student protest, fully respects the First Amendment, and has done so throughout this year. We appreciate that the encampment, named by SJP the Gaza Solidarity Encampment, although in violation of Chapter 18, was motivated by understandably passionate feelings about the devastation in Gaza, and was a source of community for many participants.

We also understand that the encampment made others in our community, especially portions of our Jewish community, feel uncomfortable and unseen. We reiterate our strong condemnation of antisemitism, Islamophobia, and hate and bigotry in all its forms, and we recognize the costs of war and displacement on so many across the globe.

In the agreement below, campus leaders have committed to addressing concerns of encampment organizers: facilitation of access for SJP to meet with decision makers to discuss disclosure and investment principles and enhanced engagement with and support for scholars and students impacted by war, violence and displacement. UW–Madison leaders will provide additional information to campus and look forward to celebrating Commencement activities with our community this weekend.

I have been working extensively with Assistant City Attorney Andy Schauer on an Intergovernmental Agreement with the City of Milwaukee. This is to allow Milwaukee to reimburse Madison for police services through a federal grant supporting the Republican National Conference this summer in Milwaukee.

We are very near to having an agreement ready for signature. We will need a Common Council resolution. Chief Barnes has briefed the Mayor on this. I am hoping the Mayor would be willing to sponsor the resolution. We are supporting the City of Milwaukee as opposed to the particular event. I think it is critically important that we support Milwaukee as a good neighbor. They reached out to us. We would be sending approximately 85 officers to Milwaukee. There is a clause in the IGA that allows the Chief to cancel sending officers or call the officers back to Madison should there be a need in Madison.

I am happy to set up a call to discuss further. Ideally we will reach agreement this week and get the resolution introduced as soon as possible. Let me know if you have questions or would like to meet.

Tentative resolution language is below:

Title

Authorizing the Mayor, Police Chief and City Clerk to sign an intergovernmental agreement with the City of Milwaukee to provide law enforcement services in response to a request for mutual aid from the Milwaukee Police Department.

Body

WHEREAS, the City of Milwaukee and the City have jointly determined that the Milwaukee Police Department will require aid to provide law enforcement services from July 13, 2024 through July 20, 2024, and that it is mutually beneficial to the general public that the Madison Police Department provide such aid when possible; and

WHEREAS, an intergovernmental agreement would allow MPD officers to provide such supplemental law enforcement services; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin Statutes provide that any Wisconsin law enforcement agency may assist a requesting Wisconsin law enforcement agency with their law enforcement efforts within the requesting agency's jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, under the intergovernmental agreement, the City of Milwaukee will reimburse the City for salary for MPD staff providing such law enforcement services, and will also provide a food per diem, as well as lodging and transportation during this period; and

WHEREAS, the City of Madison desires to enter into an intergovernmental agreement with the City of Milwaukee for the specified 8-day period to provide law enforcement support.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that upon the approval of the City Attorney and Risk Manager, the Mayor, Police Chief and City Clerk are authorized to sign an intergovernmental agreement with the City of Milwaukee to provide law enforcement aid for an 8-day period from July 13, 2024 to July 20, 2024.
